ReMode is a Community Interest Company based in Paisley and Renfrewshire, working with local people to explore creativity, sustainability and wellbeing through fashion and textiles. We run workshops, projects and volunteering opportunities that help people build skills, confidence and connections while learning about reuse, repair and sustainable fashion.

About the Youth Advisory Board

We are creating a Youth Advisory Board so that young people can help shape the future of ReMode. This group will share ideas, give feedback and work alongside our team to co-design projects, events and opportunities. Members will play an important role in making sure our work reflects the needs, interests and experiences of young people in our community. This role will work alongside our Board of Directors.

We especially welcome applications from current or previous ReMode participants, as your experience and insight are incredibly valuable.

What you'll do

As a member of the Youth Advisory Board, you will have the opportunity to:

- Share your ideas and opinions about ReMode projects and activities
- Help design new workshops, events or creative projects
- Give feedback on what works well and what could be improved
- Contribute ideas for social media or community engagement
- Explore sustainable fashion ideas and community initiatives
- Act as our youth voice to help guide ReMode's future direction
- Support evaluation by sharing your experiences and perspectives

There is no expectation to know everything - your honesty, ideas and experience are what matter most.

Commitment

- **4 meetings per year** (quarterly), approximately 2 hours each
- There will be opportunities to be involved in additional activities or events if you would like.
- We ask members to commit for around **12 months**, with the option to continue beyond this.

Who can apply

We are looking for young people who:

- Are roughly aged 13 - 25 (flexible depending on circumstances)
- Have taken part in ReMode activities, or have an interest in creativity, fashion and textiles, sustainability, or community work
- Want to share ideas and help shape projects
- Are respectful of others and willing to listen to different viewpoints

*No qualifications or previous experience are needed.

- Gain leadership and teamwork experience
- Develop ideas and creative thinking
- Contribute to real community projects
- Free access to educational/industry trips of your choice
- Strengthen your CV, college or job applications

- Access to ReMode Studio and studio materials to use on your own projects.

Support

ReMode staff will support and facilitate all meetings. We aim to create a relaxed, welcoming, and inclusive space where everyone feels comfortable sharing their views.

Travel costs will be covered, and refreshments will be provided at meetings.

Feedback from the Youth Advisory Board will be shared with the ReMode team and Board of Directors, and will help shape decisions, projects and future plans.
